MARCO CALVANI - WRITER & DIRECTOR

Italian born, Marco is an award-winning theater writer/director based in New York. Trained as an actor since he was a teenager, he made his debut as a playwright in 2002. Commissions from Todi Art Festival, Phoenix Theatre of London, Teatro di Roma, Théâtre de la Ville of Paris, La MaMa Theatre of New York and Grec Fundaciò of Barcelone followed. He wrote and directed plays translated and performed throughout Europe, Asia, US, Latin America. He created with Neil LaBute the international project AdA - Author directing Author (Spoleto Festival, Fringe Festival Madrid, La MaMa Theatre, Biennale Venice, Grec Festival Barcelone). He is a member of the Literary Board at the National Theatre of Scotland, of the Dramatists Guild of America and of the Playwrights/Directors Unit at The Actors Studio. He is the winner of the 2011 S.I.A.E. Prize for Best Playwright, of the 2013 Outstanding Playwright at Planet Connections Theatre Festivity Awards and of the 2015 Calcante Prize. He's also the recipient of the 2015 Writer Fellowship at the Edward F. Albee Foundation. The View From Up Here is his first film and it's based on his eponymous play originally commissioned by The Actors Studio and directed by Estelle Parsons. The play was chosen among over 1,000 submissions for the 42nd Samuel French Short Play Festival in 2017.

DEAN RONALDS - PRODUCER

Dean Ronalds wrote for the second season of Tyler Perry's TBS sitcom "Meet the Browns". His feature debut as a director/producer was the horror/comedy "The Netherbeast Incorporated" starring Darrel Hammond, Judd Nelson, Dave Foley and Robert Wagner, which premiered at the AFI Dallas International Film Festival. The second feature he directed was the drama "Ashley", starring Nicole Fox, Jennifer Taylor and Michael Madsen, he won as best director and best drama at the AC Film Festival. He also produced "The Graves" starring Tony Todd and Bill Mosely, released theatrically, as part of the "8 films to die for" series and "Dirty Little Trick" starring Dean Cain and Michael Madsen, currently on Showtime. He co-wrote and directed "#Screamers" which was screened at Telluride Horror Show, Nightmares Film Festival, Horror Festival, Studio City International, Buffalo Dreams and fantasy film festival as well as internationally at The Torino International Film Festival. In 2016 he wrote and directed the feature film, "Fourplay" with Tammy Blanchard, Dominic Fumusa, Emanuela Galliussi and Bryan Greenberg.

EMANUELA GALLIUSSI - PRODUCER

Emanuela Galliussi was born in Udine, Italy. She studied acting and dance and won various dance competitions and scholarships before being accepted to the prestigious Accademia Nazionale D'Arte Drammatica "Silvio D'Amico" (consider the Juilliard of Italy) in Rome. As an actress she worked in Film, TV and Theatre with top directors like Gabriele Muccino (The pursuit of happiness, Seven lives), Michele Soavi (Cemetery Man, The Goodbye Kiss), Cristina Comencini (The Best Day of my life, The Beast in the Heart), and James McTeigue (The Raven, V for Vendetta) to name a few. She lived in Paris where she collaborated with Juliette Binoche on the preparation for the role of Elle in "Certified Copy" by Abbas Kiarostami. She produced a handful of shorts as well as the feature horror film "#Screamers." She recently formed her new production company FALLING UP FILMS with Dean Ronalds under which they produced the feature film, "Fouplay" starring Tammy Blanchard, Dominic Fumusa, Emanuela Galliussi and Bryan Greenberg. She also wrote "To Fall" which is currently under the casting process by Billy Hopkins and has been selected by the "INTERNATIONAL CO-PRODUCTION FORUM" in Puglia.

DIRECTOR'S - NOTES

"The View From Up Here was originally a play Estelle Parsons commissioned me to write that she directed at The Actors Studio in New York in May 2016. Other writers and I were asked to write a play around the theme Community.

Maybe because I am an immigrant myself, maybe because through all my work, sometimes more consciously than others, I always deal with the question of identity and belonging. I had no hesitation in using the opportunity to turn the lights on an issue that was (and still is) happening all around the globe, in our cities, in our neighborhoods.

Right now there are almost 5 million of refugees in the world in need of resettlement. I couldn't ignore any longer the devastating tragedy of those who are forced to leave their homes and feel abandoned, and the rising panic of those who are afraid to lose theirs and feel invaded.

The View From Up Here was born as a play but it was immediately clear that it deserved a larger audience.

Thanks to my producers, whom I've known for many years and who fearlessly encouraged me, I decided to make my cinema debut with this project.

It is in fact a story that needs to be told *now* and *aloud*. A story that strives - through my words first and then through the devotion of everyone involved in the making - to give a voice to the endless humans amongst us who's voices are left unheard."
